This course focuses on teaching students the fundamentals of the Unity Game Engine. By the end of the course the students will build a small game from scratch in the Unity Engine. No programming knowledge is required to take this course. Students will learn basic concepts of the Unity Engine, from learning the interface of Unity to scripting basic behaviors with blueprints. Students will also learn the basics of several different modules in Unity.

This course expects you to take it upon yourself to thoroughly learn Unity as a Game Development platform. That requires a consummate commitment to learning ON YOUR OWN.

Teams are encouraged. Teams are limited to 3 people at the maximum. It is too difficult to “police” larger groups. Let me know as soon as possible if there are problems within your team.

While there will be lectures to get you moving forward, deep learning of the software will only come from making games and digging for more info on line. You must own your learning experience and seek multiple avenues to get info about the development suite we’re using.

We only have 9 class days this Spring quarter.

### **COVID-19 vaccine and booster**
